Notes to Players: (1) Players should join the division according to their date of birth.

(2) Players must complete all 3 events from A to C. Otherwise they will be disqualified.

(3) Registration fee is non-refundable no matter of any reasons, including sickness, absent, disqualified and etc. It

is also non-transferable.

Rules of Games:

This competition contains 3 games, and each player should complete all 3 games to complete the competition. These 3 games are (A) Target Distance, (B) Pitching, (C) Chipping & Putting. Full points of this competition in Super Junior Group, Junior Group and Youth Group are 100. For Junior High School Group and Senior High School Group are 120.

(A) Target Distance (30 points)

Players are required to hit 2 specific targets in a simulator room. Every player has 5 shots for the same targets. If the player hit the target, he/she can get 3 points. There are totally 10 shots and the maximum points in this game are

(B) Pitching (30 points)

Players are required to hit a ball into the basket on a specific point on the green. If player can hit a ball into the basket, who will have 6 points. If player can not hit the ball into the basket, but one can hit the frame of the basket, one can get 3 points. There are totally 5 shots and the maximum points in this game are 30.

(C) Chipping and Putting (40/60 points)

Players are required to finish the holes with chip and putt from the specified area. For scoring, please refer to the below Scoring Table. The maximum points in this game are 40/60.

Super Junior Group:

Totally 5 holes for each player. Every player can have maximum 6 strokes for each hole. Players are required to approach the next hole after the ball is in the hole/after 6 strokes for the same hole. Players must approach all 5 holes to complete this game. The maximum points in this game are 40.

Junior & Youth Group:

Totally 8 holes for each player. Every player can have maximum 6 strokes for each hole. Players are required to approach the next hole after the ball is in the hole/after 6 strokes for the same hole. Players must approach all 8 holes to complete this game. The maximum points in this game are 40.

Junior High School & Senior High School Group:

Totally 12 holes for each player. Every player can have maximum 6 strokes for each hole. Players are required to approach the next hole after the ball is in the hole/after 6 strokes for the single hole. Players must approach all 12 holes to complete this game. The maximum points in this game are 60.

Adjudication:

The total points in this competition are 100/120. The total highest point player will be determined as a champion. Each division will have one champion, first runner-up and second runner-up. In case of ties in a division, the total points of each game from A to C will be compared until the winner is decided. If the players get the same total points in each game, the winner will be decided by counting back from the last point to the first in Game A. In case, the winner still can not be decided, the winner will be determined by putting game.

Rules of Competition:

- (1) Players should arrive at the venue and report to the organizer 15 minutes (at least) before the scheduled time for the first event. They must present HKID or any valid documents for verification of their identity. The organizer reserves the right to disqualify any players who fail to prove his/her identity.
- (2) If players are late for reporting more than 5 minutes. They will be regarded as abundant their player identity.
- (3) Players are required to obey all the rules of the SCAA and Australian Golf Academy in this competition
- (4) Players should finish the games within the time limit during the competition.
- (5) Players are not allowed to accept "advice" from anyone after they have entered the course. "Advice" means any hints given which may affect the players' judgement such as the choice of clubs, alignment and ball flight direction and etc.
- (6) Non-participants are not allowed to enter the course to avoid causing disturbance to the players.
- (7) Silence should be kept when the competition is in progress.
- (8) No practices on the spot are allowed.
- (9) Ready ball accidentally moved by the player's club before stroke will be counted as a ball of the game. Air shot will also be counted as a ball of the game in this competition.
- (10) Subject to the terms stated in this prospectus, the rules and regulations currently adopted by "The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews, Scotland" and "The United States Golf Association" will be applied.
- (11) No appeal will be allowed. The decision of the judge on the site is final.
- (12) The organizer reserves the right to disqualify any players who are in breach of the rules and regulations or engage in unbecoming conduct that may affect the progress of the competition. The players' scores will be cancelled and the fee paid will not be refunded.
- (13) Players should take care of their personal belongings.

Judge:

The Australian Golf Academy will be invited for the competition judging services.

Postponement:

If typhoon signal No. 8 or above or black rainstorm warning signal is issued before 7:00am on the competition day, the competition will be cancelled and postponed to other date. Players will not be informed individually; they should visit our website www.juniorgolf.com.hk for cancellation notice, postponement arrangement and report on time as scheduled. No refund will be allowed.
